# Notes from the Nurse



All medications, **including cough drops**, must be kept in the nurse's office during the school day. Medications need to be sent in their original packaging and cannot be expired. There must be a medication form filled out and on file for all medications, **including cough drops** per district policy. These forms can be found at the front office, nurse's office or on our webpage under medication forms.

It is important to send your children with warm clothing. Tights or leggings underneath skirts and dresses, warm coats, snow pants, snow boots, hats and gloves can help your children stay warm as they go out to recess to enjoy some fresh air.



Just a reminder on the illness policy. If your child is home sick, please keep him/her home from school until they are 24 hours fever free (without the use of fever reducing medicines) and/or 24 hours vomit free. Please keep them home if they are coughing often, or if they do not feel good enough to get through the whole school day.

Please remember to call the front office if your child will be out of school that day for illness or other reasons.

# Dress Code

#### REMINDER: SRA has a dress code. Please make sure your child is in compliance.

#### A few basics:

- All students should wear a polo shirt, no button-up shirts. Colors for tops are navy, burgundy, white, hunter green (no black).
- Shirts should be tucked in.
- Belts are required for all students grades 1-8.
- Girls' jumpers and skirts can be khaki, navy, black, or French Toast burgundy plaid (but not solid burgundy or green). Hem no more than 3" above the knee. No dresses.
- Pants should not have elastic waist or hems.
- No light up shoes, no crocs.
- Socks must be solid, in the following colors only: navy, white, black, burgundy, forest green, khaki, or gray.
- Hair accessories should be small and conservative.
- Uniforms must be modest, clean, and orderly (no rips/tears, or heavy stains).
- No visible tattoos (game-day temp tattoos should be removed before returning to school).
- Snow boots may not be worn inside all day. Students should have a change of shoes to wear inside.

# Student Council

### Jeans days will be on December 8th and January 26th

Periodically, the school will hold Jeans Day. Students who choose to pay \$1.00 will be allowed to wear denim jeans with their uniform top. Denim jeans will only be allowed on designated Jeans Days. If denim jeans are worn any other time, a uniform citation will be issued, and parents will be called to bring uniform pants. The money raised on Jeans Day will go to the Student Council for projects in the school.

Guidelines for jeans worn on Jeans Day are as follows:

- No words or logos on the jeans (besides Brand logo)
- SMALL amounts of embroidery and bling will be allowed as long as it is a school appropriate design such as flowers or butterflies. (Not allowed: words or skull and crossbones, excessive bling.)
- · Must wear regular school belt (with the exception of Kindergarten)
- · No rips or holes
- · No key chains
- · No baggy or excessively wide-legged jeans
- Denim must be blue or black in color (no pink or purple jeans)
- · No denim jeggings or skirts are allowed
- Shirts need to be tucked in and jeans need to be clean.

Students who forget their money will be given a chance to call home for money or uniform pants. Students who do not follow the Jeans Day guideline will be asked to call home for an appropriate school uniform. If the problem cannot be fixed, a uniform citation will be issued. Students will pay for the jeans in their classroom.



### January 18th will be movie day.

The November food drive has ended. The two winners, one from K-5 and one from the Middle School (6-8), will be announced at the assembly on December 6th. The winning classes will select which movie their grade grouping watches for the Q2 reward on January 18th, 2024. Since we have surpassed our school-wide goal to get more cans than last year, the Student Council will also be providing an individually wrapped snack to eat during the movie. Students may bring a small pillow that day and their water bottle to watch the movie.



# **Board Notes**

Hello from the SRA Board of Directors,

At the November meeting, the board heard a presentation from the Development Working Group, which has been researching fundraising practices at other charter schools. During the past few months, the group identified a list of similar charter schools and explored how those schools raise and spend private-support funds. The group is recommending that SRA hire a consultant to help us shape our own fundraising goals and strategies. We will be considering this suggestion at our December meeting.

The board has advertised for bids for Phase 1B of our expansion project, and we plan to approve a bid in December, with construction to start next year. The board also approved a proposal for a property survey, which is one of the first steps in improving our playground.

### FORGIVENESS

To forgive is to set a prisoner free and discover the prisoner was you.-Unknown

The character trait for the month of January is forgiveness. Character First Education defines forgiveness as letting go of bitterness and revenge stating, "forgiveness is not a feeling, and it does not take away or excuse what others have done. Real forgiveness is recognizing the problem and all the pain and hurt that comes with it – and then choosing to let go of any bitterness, anger, and desire for revenge so you can move on with life."

In forgiving others, we will discuss and practice using the "4-Part Apology". The "4-Part Apology" is a technique for forgiveness that I learned from Quantum Learning for Teachers and Students. It encourages individuals to maintain good relationships with others. In the "4-part Apology" the offender first acknowledges what they have done wrong, then apologizes, asks what they can do to make it right, and finally recommits to trying not to make the same mistake in the future. Practical ways like the "4-Part Apology" can help ease the severity of holding on to grudges that can make one unhappy and bitter.

There are many benefits to forgiving according to the Mayo Clinic. Some of these benefits of forgiving include healthier relationships, less stress, lower blood pressure, fewer symptoms of depression and anxiety, and lower risk of alcohol and substance abuse.

Ultimately, the desire at SRA is to have an atmosphere that is safe and understanding. We want students to leave SRA with a remembrance of a good experience. Regardless of where you go to school, work, or live, without forgiveness one could have a miserable experience.

Middle school students will begin their Invasion Games mini-unit in December followed by Rhythm and Dance in January.  $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$  graders have begun their Team Handball season to be followed by sampling of a variety of invasion games with Rhythm and Dance beginning in January. K-2<sup>nd</sup> graders will wrap up their locomotor and manipulative exploratory unit and begin volleying and striking skills which will lead into a sampling of net/wall games with a few weeks of Rhythm and Dance mixed in at the beginning of January.

Finally, 3rd graders will visit the Laramie Ice and Event Center for ice skating and hot chocolate (donated by the Human Bean) on December 5<sup>th</sup>.

### Snow Day? Blizzard Bags are the Answer

In anticipation of snow days throughout our school year, we have compiled a "Blizzard Packet" for students to keep at home. The activities/lessons in your student's packet reflect grade-level work to be completed if a Snow Day is called during our unpredictable winter season.

#### **ELEMENTARY STUDENTS**

The Temporary Virtual Education Plan for K-5, outlined by SRA and ACSD#1, calls for Blizzard Packet to be sent home with students. Completing the Blizzard Packet will account for your student's attendance should we need to be closed for winter conditions.

#### How does this work?

Blizzard Packets are sent home early in the school year and are expected to be kept at home and used if needed. A second Blizzard Packet will be sent home if the school is closed on two separate accounts. Students are to complete the grade level classroom activities/lessons and at minimum one activity/lesson for a special class (art, music, technology, library, PE).

#### What do we do with the Blizzard Packet?

Please keep the Blizzard Packet in an accessible place until it is needed. The activities/lessons included only need to be completed by students if an official Snow Day is called.

#### When do we return the Blizzard Packet?

The student will have three days from the time we return to school after an official Snow Day to return the lessons/activities to their classroom teachers for attendance to be recorded. If the Blizzard Packet is not returned within three school days your child will be marked as unexcused for the day.

#### Are we able to receive Blizzard Packet electronically?

Yes, teachers are encouraged to have digital copies of their Blizzard Packet that can be shared with parents/guardians.

#### Does this mean we will not make up snow days in June?

Yes, Blizzard Packets are intended to turn official Snow Days into Virtual Education Days, meaning additional days will not need to be made up at the end of the school year.
