Dress Code

REMINDER: SRA has a dress code. Please make sure your child is in compliance.

A few basics:

- All students should wear a polo shirt, no button-up shirts. Colors for tops are navy, burgundy, white, hunter green (no black).
- Belts are required for all students grades 1-8.
- Girls' jumpers and skirts can be khaki, navy, black, or French Toast burgundy plaid (but not solid burgundy or green). Hem no more than 3" above the knee. No dresses.
- Pants should not have elastic waist or hems.
- No light up shoes, no crocs.
- Socks must be solid, in the following colors only: navy, white, black, burgundy, forest green, khaki, or gray.
- Hair accessories should be small and conservative.
- Uniforms must be modest, clean, and orderly (no rips/tears, or heavy stains).
- No visible tattoos (game-day temp tattoos should be removed before returning to school).

- CHECK-IN MADE EASY WITH KEY FOBS: We issue bar-code key fobs for parents who frequently visit school. This makes your computer check in/out **fast** and **easy**. Please fill out <u>this</u> form to request a fob. Key fobs are name-specific and are assigned to you for the duration of your child being enrolled at SRA, so please hang onto them! Kindly notify the office if your fob is lost or damaged. Thank you.



MESSAGES TO STUDENTS: Parents requesting messages to be sent to their student (ex: change of plans for parent pick-up or riding bus), must notify the office no later than 2:45 pm. Beyond that time, we <u>cannot</u> guarantee your child will receive the message. Thank you for your understanding.

Board Notes

Hello from the SRA Board of Directors,

A few notes on board processes: As a governmental entity, the SRA Board of Directors must adhere to Wyoming open meetings laws, especially as they pertain to school boards. According to these rules, our meetings take place at a regularly scheduled time and date, and meeting agendas and minutes are public record. Members of the public are allowed to comment to the board at each meeting during a specific time and according to parameters established by the board.

The board is allowed to adjourn into a confidential executive session only for specific reasons listed in Wyoming Statute, and our discussion is limited to the statutory reason provided in the agenda. By law, the board may not take any action during an executive session.

Whenever the board wishes to create a new policy or amend an existing policy, that process is conducted over several meetings and in the public eye, with multiple opportunities for public input.

We appreciate the SRA community's respectful, thoughtful feedback as issues arise. Thank you for helping us further the school's mission of providing an excellent education to all students based on values of inclusiveness, fairness and respect.

Students are successfully working through their educational gymnastics unit. K-5 finished working on balance, strength, jumping, landing, and traveling in September and will begin weight transfer skills (rocking and rolling, forward and side rolls, and cartwheels) in early October, finishing with group sequences on October 5th. Following educational gymnastics, K-2 will begin kicking skills with 3-5, moving on to Jump Rope and Soccer skills at the end of the month. In addition, 3-5 will participate in fitness activities, fitness testing, and SMART goal setting to improve fitness-related components (muscle strength and endurance, cardiorespiratory endurance, flexibility, and body composition) throughout the year. Middle school students have been working through their educational gymnastics unit following a sport education instructional model. Students were placed in teams and given team roles, which included Coach, Trainer, Spirit Leader, Equipment Manager, and Personal and Social Representative. Points were awarded for individuals performing their team roles and participating in team sequence development and execution. Students worked well within their teams and came up with some creative performances! We have one more performance on October 3rd, followed by fitness testing on October 5th. Then, we'll begin our net/wall unit with 6th grade Volleyball, 7th grade Pickleball, and 8th grade Badminton.
