Welcome to a new year of incredible learning opportunities. It is delightful to be back together with our wonderful students, families and staff. We have much to be thankful for as a school community. SRA's continued growth and success is an example of the positive effects parental involvement and school choice. SRA's Phase 1A expansion is very near completion and we now have occupancy for the new indoor space. 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School Basics

- SRA's normal school day runs from 8:15 a.m. 3:15 p.m.
- Dismissal time for ALL half days is <u>11:15 a.m.</u>
- No student is to arrive prior to 7:45 a.m. Doors are locked until that time.
- Our doors open at 3:00 p.m. for Parent Lobby Pick-up. Doors are locked prior to that time.
- Students must be picked up no later than 3:30 p.m.
- Please call or email the front office if your child is going to be absent. Calls are expected for each and every day of the absence.
- Please follow parking lot protocol for pick-up, drop-offs, and parking. Staff come and
 go at all hours of the school day; please respect their reserved areas. Visitor parking
 areas are clearly marked. A diagram is included in the Student-Parent Handbook,
 located on the school website.
- Please DO NOT use the Bus Lane, unless directed to pass through during pick up. No parking in the bus lane.
- ALL visitors must sign in and out at the front desk. While visiting, please turn cell phones to vibrate.
- Uniforms must follow SRA's Uniform Code. No exceptions. Uniforms are required every day, unless otherwise instructed. PTA Spirit Wear is **not** part of Dress Code.
- NO GLASS WATER BOTTLES! No glass lunch/snack containers.
- NO toys/balls are to be brought to school.
- Students may not have smartwatches.
- SRA is a GUM-FREE school.
- Please send your child with appropriate outerwear, and remember
 always be prepared for weather changes.

Notes from the Nurse

Happy Fall (almost). I hope everyone had a fun and restful summer.

Immunizations:

Per Wyoming State Law, all students must have a <u>current</u> immunization record or exemption on file within 30 days of school starting.

Students missing required vaccinations after the 30 days (September 22nd) will be excluded from school and activities. Please ensure that your child(ren) are current on all required immunizations. **All 7th graders are required to have a Tdap vaccine for school**. Most medical providers offer this at the 11 or 12-year physical. If you are not sure if your child has had their Tdap vaccine required for 7th grade, please check with your medical provider.



Medications:

Per school policy the nurse cannot give any prescription or over the counter medications to students without written permission. All prescription and over the counter medicines must be in the original container and must not be expired. All medications (including cough drops) must be kept in the nurse's office while at school.

Illness:



If your child is sick, please keep them home. Per school policy they can return to school once they are fever free for 24 hours (without the use of fever reducing medicine), or vomiting/diarrhea free for 24 hours.

The Snowy Range Academy Board of Directors meets at 6 p.m. on the third Wednesday of each month at the school. We encourage everyone in the SRA community to attend in person or online via Zoom.
