From the Principal's Desk

Dear Snowy Range Academy Families,

I can't believe we have already made it to April! I hope that all of you are surviving these last few months of the school year as we head into the final term.

I'd like to take a moment to thank all of you for the academic support you give to your students. This is one of the biggest contributors to Snowy Range students being so incredibly successful, and our teachers and staff appreciate the hard work you put in at home.

As most of you know, the WYTOPP assessments will be administered toward the end of the month. This is a summative assessment measuring your students' competency on state standards. This is obviously a very important assessment, arguably the most important assessment of the year, and we want to encourage our students to be prepared to do their very best. WYTOPP will begin on April 22nd and the various testing sessions will be held throughout the week. Please be sure that your students arrive on time and are in attendance every day during this week. As a side note, some of your students have already taken the writing section of the WYTOPP (grades 3, 5, and 7). The Wyoming Department of Education assigned ACSD1, including Snowy Range Academy, to administer the writing section the week before Spring Break. Unfortunately, they scheduled the week of Spring Break for any makeup assessments. Therefore, if your student was not here for the writing section of the WYTOPP, they will not be able to make it up, as per the scheduling error from WDE. We have already been in contact with them regarding this error and we hope that this is not an issue in the future.


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Substitutes Wanted!

IMMUNIZATIONS FOR STUDENTS ENTERING 7TH GRADE NEXT YEAR

Wyoming state immunization requirements mandate that all students entering seventh grade must have a booster dose of diphtheria/tetanus/ pertussis containing vaccine (Tdap). Your healthcare provider might also recommend other important vaccinations for your pre-teen such as immunizations to prevent Meningitis, Hepatitis A and Human Papillomavirus. Please remember to send an updated immunization record to school after your child has received any new vaccinations.

EMERGENCY LOANER CLOTHING

Please check your laundry area for any articles of clothing loaned to your student during the school year. All loaned clothing is marked in the waistband, neckband or on the backside with the initials SRA. We would appreciate the return of this clothing as soon as possible.

Jeans Day will be on April 26, 2024

Periodically, the school will hold Jeans Day. Students who choose to pay \$1.00 will be allowed to wear denim jeans with their uniform top. Denim jeans will only be allowed on designated Jeans Days. If denim jeans are worn any other time, a uniform citation will be issued, and parents will be called to bring uniform pants. The money raised on Jeans Day will go to the Student Council for projects in the school.

Guidelines for jeans worn on Jeans Day are as follow:

- · No words or logos on the jeans (besides Brand logo)
- · SMALL amounts of embroidery and bling will be allowed as long as it is a school appropriate design such as flowers or butterflies. (Not allowed: words or skull and crossbones, excessive bling.)
- · Must wear regular school belt (with the exception of Kindergarten)
- · No rips or holes
- · No key chains
- · No baggy or excessively wide-legged jeans
- · Denim must be blue or black in color (no pink or purple jeans)
- · No denim jeggings, or skirts are allowed
- · Shirts need to be tucked in and jeans need to be clean.

Students who forget their money will be given a chance to call home for money or uniform pants. Students who do not follow the Jeans Day guideline will be asked to call home for an appropriate school uniform. If the problem cannot be fixed, a uniform citation will be issued. Students will pay for the jeans and get a stamp by the front office.

*Classroom teachers will reserve the right to make final dress code decisions.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

- #1 What is the composition of the SRA Board? 10 members of which 7 shall be voting members; shall include 5 parents of enrolled students, 2 community members, a Board Member Emeritus, the Principal, and one Employee Member. The Board Member Emeritus, Principal, and Employee Member shall serve as non-voting members.
- #2 What is the time commitment? It can vary depending on committees, positions, and current events. Board members report spending 1 to 5 hours per week accordingly.
- **#3 What is expected for attendance?** In-person attendance at monthly board meetings and assigned committee meetings. Virtual attendance is possible if extenuating circumstances are an issue. Communication with the Board Chair is expected if you are going to miss a meeting. It is also expected that Board members will observe instruction, attend other regular school functions, attend special meetings, ensure confidentiality for human resources and executive session discussions, and listen to parents and staff about concerns.
- #4 How are Committees and Board positions determined? These are determined each year by the Board and vary in time requirements. Standing committees include Finance, Hiring, and Nominating, and Ad Hoc committees include Facilities, Marketing/Development, Technology, and High School. Positions include Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- #5 What kinds of skills are needed? A prospective Board member would need to be willing to learn about conducting public meetings, the SRA Charter and Bylaws, curriculum, human resources, SRA finances, the relationship with ACSD#1, and applicable county, state, and federal laws and statutes.

The SRA Board of Directors has been working in several different areas recently. The Board continues to think through various options regarding continued expansion to accommodate enrollment increases.
