Dear SRA Families,

In January we moved all communication notices to REMIND. You will get messages from us, as well as from the District. You can download the Remind App onto your phone. You are also in control of how you receive messages—via email, text, or both.

How to Join Remind for Updates from Albany County School District #1 and its Schools







- 1. Head to the Remind website, and click on "Sign Up" in the upper right-hand corner.
- 2. Create an account by using either an email address or phone number. You will then be asked to enter a code that has been sent to the phone or email address you gave.
- 3. Enter your name and a password you would like for your account, and click "Complete sign up."







- 4. You will select "I'm a parent" when Remind prompts this screen. After that, you can add a phone number if you began with email.
- 5. You can then join a class by entering a class code if you know it, or by searching for your child(ren)'s school and teacher.
- 6. Once you find the teacher, you can join the class your child(ren) has with that teacher. When you have picked all the classes, select "Done." You are all set to receive notifications from Remind.

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Student Council

For the month of February, the Student Council has decided to raise money for Family Promise of Albany County.

They help support those experiencing homelessness within our community. To support this, each Friday in February we will have an optional, fun activity students may pay to participate in.

Feb. 2- \$0.25 Hat Day Students will still be required to wear their regular school uniforms but may wear a ball cap, stocking cap, or cowboy hat that is smaller and school appropriate (no inappropriate pictures or words displayed). Masks may not be a part of the hat, students faces must be visible.





Feb. 9- \$0.50 Hoodie and/or Crazy Socks Day Students will still wear their uniform shirt, belt, and pants. They may wear a school appropriate hoodie, zip up or pull over, over their uniform shirt. They <u>may not</u> have the hood up within the building. No masks should be included in their hoodie because student faces must be visible. For the \$0.50 donation students may wear a hoodie or crazy socks or both.

Feb. 16- \$0.75 Crazy Hair Day Students will still wear their regular uniform but may come to school with crazy hair. Any words, pictures, or designs must be school appropriate. Any crazy hair designs should be temporary, nothing permanent. Evidence of the crazy hair should be gone by the following Monday.





Feb. 23- \$1 Dress Like a Teacher Day Students do not have to wear a school uniform **IF** they dress like one of the teachers. Any clothing should still be school appropriate (shorts, skirts, or dress should be no more than 3" above the knee; shoulders and torsos are covered; clothing is appropriate to participate in the activities throughout the day; no sandals).

Students who forget their money will be given a chance to call home for money or uniform clothing for the day. Students who do not follow the guidelines will be asked to call home for an appropriate school uniform. If the problem cannot be fixed, a uniform citation will be issued. Students will pay to participate in each fun activity by the front door.

There will be **no jeans day** during the month of February to accommodate the fun, Friday activities.

Board Notes

Hello from the SRA Board of Directors,

The SRA Board of Directors met three times in December and once in January. On Dec. 6, the Board approved a bid from Shepard Construction for Phase 1B of our expansion project. Construction is underway in the back of the building, and we're looking forward to the addition of three new classrooms and a set of bathrooms by next fall.

On Dec. 20, the Board approved the first reading of the 2024-25 academic calendar while also considering ways to include Board input in calendar considerations. The Board approved the hiring of a consultant to help SRA establish a fundraising program.

On Jan. 17, the Board discussed reviving the after-school program that was in operation until several years ago. The Board plans to continue exploring the feasibility of the program and gauging potential participation.

Interim principal Stephanie Diediker began her position on Jan. 22, while we said farewell to Mr. Cowper on Jan. 18. The interim position will run through June 30, and the process of hiring a permanent principal has begun.

The next board meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. Feb. 21. All meetings take place at SRA and stream online via Zoom. To view agendas and meeting minutes, visit the Board of Directors page on the website and click on the link for BoardDocs.


