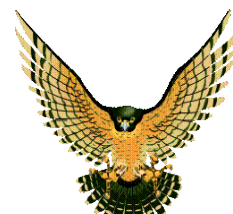

SIXTH GRADE

LANGUAGE ARTS

In sixth grade, the students will continue reading *The Prince and the Pauper*. We will focus on comprehension strategies and identifying and analyzing narrative devices. There will be no spelling quiz due to testing.

SOCIAL STUDIES

SPANISH 1A

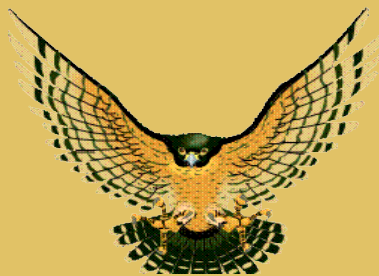

LANGUAGE ARTS
