## MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

All student medications at SRA must be taken home before the last day of the school year, June 4th. In mid-May, I will send home a letter to parents of students who have medications at school to let you know the medications that need to be taken home. I prefer that parents pick the medications up from the school, however if you are truly unable to do this, I will send medications home with your student if I have a signed parent permission form. Please be advised that all medications left at SRA after the last day of school, June 4th, will be disposed of.

## IMMUNIZATIONS FOR STUDENTS ENTERING $7^{\text {TH }}$ GRADE

Wyoming state immunization requirements mandate that all students entering seventh grade must have a booster dose of diphtheria/tetanus/ pertussis containing vaccine (Tdap). Your healthcare provider might also recommend other important vaccinations for your pre-teen such as immunizations to prevent Meningitis, Hepatitis A and Human Papillomavirus. Please remember to send an updated immunization record to school after your child has received any new vaccinations.

## EMERGENCY LOANER CLOTHING

Please check your laundry area for any articles of clothing that were loaned to your student during the school year. All loaned clothing is marked in the waist band, neck band or on the back side with the initials SRA. We would appreciate the return of this clothing prior to the end of the school year.

## UPCOMING FIELD DAY AND SKIN PROTECTION

Field day is scheduled for Friday, May $31^{\text {st }}$. Parents, PLEASE check the weather to make sure that your student is prepared for the weather... a light jacket might be necessary if the day is cool and windy. A hat/head protection and SUNSCREEN are highly recommended. Remember that sunburns can happen even on cloudy/overcast days!
Have a safe and healthy summer! Enjoy the outdoors, but remember to wear protective clothing and apply sunscreen/ insect repellants as per product instructions. I look forward to seeing you all back in August!

Hello from the SRA Board of Directors,
The SRA Board of Directors is gearing up for Board elections and looking ahead to the end of this school year and next fall.
Board elections are underway, with openings this spring for three parent members and one community member. Results will be announced at the annual meeting on May 15. Watch your email for information about candidates and how to vote. The Board will be filling the emeritus member opening this summer.

Hiring is underway for multiple staff positions, including three elementary teachers, middle school language arts, middle school social studies and art, plus a counselor. Mrs. Diediker is leading the hiring process, with hiring committees composed of staff, Board members and parents interviewing candidates and watching teaching demonstrations. The Board scheduled a special meeting on April 30 to consider and approve Mrs. Diediker's recommendations.

SRA plans to participate in WyoGives, a statewide fundraising initiative led by the Wyoming Nonprofit Network. This year's event is scheduled for July 10. Be watching social media and Remind for information about how to support SRA!

## Board Election Guidelines

Snowy Range Academy voting will occur online prior to the Annual Meeting on May 15th. The ballot will close at 10:00 am on May 15th, with the results tallied and announced at the Annual Meeting.

Section 4.13. Elections to the Board of Directors. Elections for expiring positions for the Board of Directors
shall beheld during the Annual Meeting of the Members of SRA. Elections for the Board of Directors shall be conducted as follows:

1. For voting purposes, each family of a student or students and each employee of the Charter School shall be entitled to one vote. If an employee is also a parent member, s/he may have only one vote for each Director's vacancy. In the case of married employees, only one may vote for each voting Director's vacancy. If more than one vote is cast by a particular family or employee, then all votes for that family or employee shall be disqualified and not considered;
2. Member families and employees may vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled;
3. Elections shall be by secret ballot;
4. Elections shall be determined by simple majority of votes cast;

The Nominating Committee shall conduct, tabulate the results of, and certify the results of all elections. Certification of election results shall be presented to the Board of Directors at the conclusion of the election at the Annual Meeting. Newly elected Directors are encouraged to attend as non-voting Directors meetings of the Board until they assume their duties as Directors.

 Council and teachers of SRA I will: **Not receive detention in the fourth quarter. (If I do, my attendance at the Luau will be based on the reason for my detention at the teacher's discretion); **Get no more than 3 signatures for respect in the four weeks before the Luau. ** No serious offense forms. (Vandalism, Fighting, etc.) If I do any of the above offenses, I will be uninvited to the school Luau. The final say will be at the principal's hands depending on my behavior. For Parents: Should bad behavior occur during the Luau, the parent will be asked to come pick up their child.
